



*<sup>13</sup> indeed it came to pass, when the trumpeters and singers were as one, to make one sound to be heard in praising and thanking the Lord... that the house of the Lord, was filled with a cloud, <sup>14</sup> so that the priests could not continue ministering because of the cloud; for the glory of the Lord filled the house of God.*




